From the President Hello Everyone,

This is my first President's Report since being elected at the AGM held in September. The election side of things went smoothly, but the meeting itself got a bit heated – all to do with whether a Management Committee member resigned or was removed. The answer is resigned – twice – once at a MC meeting and again by email later - I have the email. I just wanted to clear up that small controversy right from the start, so that everyone is clear about what occurred. I would like everything about GSQ to be enjoyable for all members – even AGMs. We are participating in a hobby after all, and everyone who assists with running the society is doing so voluntarily. In that light, we should all respect one another's right to quiet enjoyment of that hobby and be thankful to those members who do step forward to assist in management. We who do volunteer should not then develop "ownership issues" over what we do – as family historians we should all realise that nothing is forever, and enjoyment is the name of the game. That will be my mantra.

There have been some changes to the committee this year. Obviously, Margaret Doherty has stepped down from being President, but remains on the committee. I would like to thank her on behalf of the society for her dedication over almost eight years as President. I have no intention of being President for anywhere near that length of time. Margaret Coleman, Christine Meehan and Barbara Robinson left the committee and I also wish to thank them for their commitment to the Society.

There are three new members of the Management Committee this year: Claire Rodwell, Hugh Smith and Sharyn Merkley. They bring a range of experience to the committee, especially as we are moving – moving as you are reading this most likely!

As you would be aware, the previous management committee decided to take advantage of the fact that the Fisher Street lease was up for renewal at the end of November, and to look for new premises – because of the parking, dance studio noise and water ingress problems experienced. This proved to be a bit difficult as there was nothing really suitable in GSQ's price range. Luckily the property at 25 Stackpole Street, Wishart was pointed out to us and on inspection it proved suitable for purpose. Unfortunately, the lease negotiations were more protracted than was helpful, but in mid-October GSQ had the keys to new premises.

The building is an old martial arts training hall. There is a large central hall space that is ideal for the society's family history library research function. There are 17 car spaces onsite, with plenty of free parking on the surrounding streets as well. This is a complete contrast to Fisher Street. At Stackpole Street GSQ will also gain exposure to passing traffic on Mt. Gravatt-Capalaba Road – an unparalleled advertising opportunity that GSQ has never had before. There are no noisy neighbours and there is no flood problem.

As with all moves though, there is much work to do. Both in preparing the books, equipment and office holdings at the old site for the move, and the building at the new site to receive it all. And the new site does require work. It could be described as a bit of a "fixer-upperer!" The owners have done work on the floor – removing the old judo matting that was glued to it, and sheeting it over. Then GSQ was allowed in to paint.

Over the period of 16-20 October, I and a small group of volunteers managed to clean the walls, patched holes and remove excess wiring and old blinds. Then we applied two coats of paint. On 20th October, pre-primed skirting boards were installed and also given two coats of paint. There was a deadline to all this, as it had to be completed by Friday, 23 October, as that is the day for the carpet laying.

I would like to acknowledge the wonderful assistance provided by the painting volunteers: Bob Thompson, Bob McAllister, Gerald Barns, Angie Hawes, Kay Aberdeen, Ian Hunt, Claire Rodwell and Lorraine Digney. They all contributed willingly and we managed to complete everything two days before the carpet laying.

And then Marg and I left on a six-week holiday! Yes, right in the middle of the move. We could do nothing about this as the holiday was booked well in advance of the move even being thought of. I am writing this report in the air on the way to London. Pretty much everything else will be completed by the time of our return. Well, I hope so – but that is in the future.

The rest of the move is in the hands of Carole Williamson (Vice-President) and Helen Connor (Secretary) and they have organised a comprehensive schedule of tasks for the move. They will require help, and I hope other members will volunteer their time in the same way as the painting crew helped me. The old GSQ premises will also have to be cleaned and repainted once all equipment, books and other items have been moved over to Wishart. Please contact Carole or Helen if you are able to help in any small way.

This is an exciting time for GSQ, with a great opportunity to make a new beginning at new premises. But I also know that change is a hard process to go through, and not all members will embrace the move wholeheartedly. Some will be disadvantaged by the move out into the southern suburbs, while others will find it much easier to get to the new GSQ. Swings and roundabouts. However, I believe the move is worthwhile and justified, and I hope to see as many of you as possible at our new family history home.
