From the President

However, my little problem does have a silver lining, of sorts. It gives me the perfect opportunity to remind you all that you should all be practicing either a backup policy for your important family history data files and documents, or at least storing copies in a cloud repository and synching them with the copies on your desktop and/or laptop. I have these solutions in place – but do I make use of them rigorously? No. Therein lies my problem. If I had saved my original copy to my free Microsoft One Drive account, which is a cloud storage solution that uses someone else's servers elsewhere in the world to store my stuff, I would have had access to it on the laptop I am using now by simply logging into that account, whenever my mobile phone had signal access and I could use its internet hot-spot function.

Technology, in all its various forms, can be a wonderful tool – but we must be rigorous in using it. Always back up data and documents, and always to at least two different locations, one of which should be in the cloud, which would give you access to it from almost anywhere. If only I had practiced what I preach now. I do this for our 5000+ book collection as a matter of course – yes, books are as much an obsession for us as is family history. So why don't I do this for other, just as important data and documents? I don't know really, and can't give a good answer. Perhaps it was the "It can't happen to me" syndrome. Well, it can and it did! So, please don't do what I didn't do.

Whatever solution you choose need not cost you anything – other than the time it takes to set up and the commitment involved in carrying it out. If you avoid just one little problem like my current difficulty with this document's predecessor, you have reaped your reward. You are going to do it, aren't you??

Speaking of technology, the GSQ website has two current issues of its own, one of which is ongoing and one that is fixed.

The ongoing issue is the GSQ online shop. It is not working correctly as far as payment acceptance details go – the most important part, of course - and the reason for this is currently being looked into. The current work around for this is that if you look at the shop and find something of interest, phone GSQ on 3349 6072and order and pay that way. GSQ hopes to have this problem fixed shortly.

The fixed issue is to do with access to MyGSQ. If you are having any problems logging into MyGSQ on the GSQ website, please contact me via email at president@gsq.org.au and I will rectify it for you.


