#### From the President

Who would have thought that the Annual General Meeting of the society would be a news-worthy event of any note? Well, this year's meeting is! That is because we are actually going to have an election. In past years it has been a bit of a struggle to get enough nominations for the various positions on the Management Committee. Those who did nominate were automatically elected with no vote required. This year is different. If you cannot attend the AGM on the 8th October, please consider providing a Proxy vote to someone who is attending, so that your vote can be counted.

Some members are already aware of this, but the Southern Suburbs branch of GSQ is no more. Due to a variety of reasons – closeness to GSQ itself after the move last year and an inability to gain nominations for committee members being amongst the major reasons – the branch was wound up in August. The closeness of the two organisations, one in Mt. Gravatt the other at Wishart, was always going to be an issue, but no-one envisioned a problem arising within a year.

The essence of Southern Suburbs will live on at GSQ however. It is envisioned that their popular evening talks will continue on at GSQ, probably on the 2nd Wednesday opening night. Stay tuned for further information on that. Also, Southern Suburbs passed on a final bank balance to GSQ that will enable us to upgrade our computer fleet, and probably put funds towards a new digital camera for our ongoing digitisation and indexing projects – no more micro-fiche, it will all be digital. GSQ currently has a grant application for computer upgrades lodged with TransUrban, the freeway people, and it remains to be seen what the decision is there before allocation of the Southern Suburbs funds can be made fully.

Speaking of funds, but spending them this time: the Management Committee has begun looking into moving the kitchen/lunch area from downstairs to upstairs – in the blue toilet/shower room area. This will initially involve moving the blue toilet over into the pink room shower, and removing the shower. A quote for \$925.00 (without GST) has been received for the plumbing work involved. Other quotes will need to be obtained and the shower will need to be converted to a toilet – the wall panelling will need to be changed/painted. If this goes ahead, it will give GSQ two toilets in one room and a lunch/kitchen/storage area in the other. The lunch room side of things might be a little cramped, but would not be any worse than the lunch room at Fisher Street was.

If GSQ does this, it will free up more space downstairs for storage. Many of the filing cabinets that are dotted around the upstairs area will be able to be moved downstairs – and a large portion of their contents should be able to be scanned and stored in digital format (in the fullness of time) and so reduce storage space requirements even further. Once the filing cabinets are moved downstairs, the book cases currently lined up the middle of the room should be able to be moved over to the walls vacated by the filing cabinets and so free up more space in the middle of the research centre.

That is my "big picture" outlook for GSQ in the near future. All this takes time and a domino effect ensues because things have to happen one at a time, before the next thing scheduled behind it can occur. Also, it will require help from members to be done in a timely fashion! Everyone, I'm looking at "you".

That's all from me for this month. See you at the AGM – I'll be there.
