Ballygilbert Presbyterian Church records online

From Emerald Ancestors - www.emeraldancestors.com - Baptismal records for Ballygilbert Presbyterian Church in the parish of Bangor, County Down have now been added to the birth database.

These entries cover the period 1841 to 1901 inclusive, and include the Child's name, Father's name, Mother's Maiden name, Date of Birth & Date of Baptism. Townland is also included in a number of entries in the database.

More Aberdeenshire records added to Deceased Online

From Deceased Online - www.deceasedonline.com - We've started a long project to upload all burial records for all of the 200+ burial grounds managed by Aberdeenshire Council.

Records for 20 burial grounds have just been added to the database joining those for Peterhead's historic St Peter's Churchyard and main cemetery.

Indexes to statutory records for the Republic of Ireland are available from 1845-1958 on FamilySearch, Ancestry and FindmyPast.

York Peculiars original probate documents from Origins.net

From Origins - www.origins.net - Obtaining copies of the original probate documents for York Peculiars Probate Collection 1383-1857 has now been made easier and cheaper.

Most of the York Peculiars Probate records held at The Borthwick Institute for Archives have been digitised, and National Wills Index subscribers can now purchase the original documents images using Pay per View credits and view these images directly from the index records.

This collection makes available, exclusively on the National Wills Index, a comprehensive index to over 25,000 wills and other probate documents proved in the 54 Peculiar Courts of the Province of York between 1383 and 1857.

HistoricGraves.com - An Online Graves and Graveyards Finder for Ireland (<http://www.historicgraves.com>)

The Historic Graves project is a community focused grassroots heritage project. All information is contributed by volunteers and all information on the site is available to everyone, free of charge. The volunteers are located in Ireland and are part of local community groups who have been trained in low-cost, high-tech field surveys of historic graveyards and recording of their own oral histories. Together, they have built a multi-media online written, visual, and audio record of the historic graves in their own areas and have contributed the information to the Historic Graves project.

This is a great resource for anyone researching Irish ancestry. It is a "work in progress." That is, not all graveyards have been surveyed yet but new information is being added frequently. You can see a map of the completed graveyards at <http://historicgraves.com/graveyardsmap>. Click on an area of interest on the map to "zoom in" and see the details.

Good News about Forthcoming Online Service for Birth, Marriage & Death Records from Northern Ireland

The North of Ireland Family History Society's Facebook page has some good news for anyone researching ancestors in what is now Northern Ireland. The GRONI (the General Register Office for Northern Ireland) spent about 3 years and a lot of money digitising their records. Those records are now expected to be available online within one or two months.

BillionGraves and MyHeritage Work Together to Digitize the World's Cemeteries

BillionGraves and MyHeritage recently announced that they are working in collaboration to bring about the digitization of the world's cemeteries. This new arrangement will result in tens of millions of family historians and genealogists from around the world working together to digitally capture and preserve images of cemetery tombstones, record their GPS locations and create valuable new indexes of these images. These two companies will work together to make the BillionGraves website and app available in 25 languages. FamilySearch Adds Close to 4.2 Million Indexed Records and Images to Collections from Australia, Brazil, Canada, Germany, Italy, United Kingdom, and the United States

FamilySearch has added close to 4.2 million indexed records and images to collections from Australia, Austria, Brazil, Belgium, Canada, Dominican Republic, France, Germany, Honduras, Italy, New Zealand, Peru, Spain, United Kingdom, and the United States. Notable collection updates include the 543,676 images from the **Brazil, São Paulo, Immigration Cards, 1902–1980 collection**; the **499,702 indexed records and images from the New Zealand, Archives New Zealand, Probate Records, 1848–1991 collection**; and the **264,610 images from the United Kingdom, World War I Women's Army Auxiliary Corps Records, 1917–1920 collection**. Search these diverse collections and more than 3.5 billion other records for free at www.FamilySearch.org.

FamilySearch has added more than 4.5 million indexed records and images to collections from Brazil, China, Colombia, Ghana, Italy, Netherlands, Paraguay, Philippines, Portugal, Spain, and the United States. Notable collection updates include the **1,165,725 indexed records from the U.S., West Virginia Marriages, 1780–1970, collection**; the **469,903 images from the Ghana Census, 1984**; and the **415,997 indexed records from the United States Census, 1860**.
