Hi everyone

The Resource Centre at Fisher Street has a new look. The new microfiche cabinets arrived and now all our many thousands of microfiche are in three compact cabinets giving us room to have the microfilm and microfiche readers where the fiche were previously stored. This, in turn, allows more room where the microfilm readers previously were. We have also purchased new lighter tables in place of the four old heavy tables that had to be moved for every education session. Thank you to all the volunteers who assisted, particularly Helen Connor and Carole Williamson. I think it looks much better and less cluttered. What do you think? Come along and have a look.

The first New Members' Meeting was held in April. This was attended by members who had joined GSQ in the previous three months. We were pleased with the enthusiasm of the new members and have decided to continue to hold this on a regular basis. The next meeting is Saturday 5 July 2014.
