Click on the black title bar that turns orange when you hover the mouse pointer over it and you will go to the Blog page where many interesting posts can be found. And they go back to mid-2014! Lots of reading there, eh?

Turning to other matters. This eNews has been delivered to you via a different method. GSQ is now using ReachMail for the delivery of eNews. This is because our monthly newsletter is now free to everyone – GSQ members and non-members alike. Non GSQ members will soon be able to sign up to receive eNews right from the Home page on the website. It is hoped that this method will help grow awareness of GSQ and what it has to offer family historians generally. Past members will also be on the list, and may in time be attracted back to the society.
