Vale Carole Ann Williamson 1946 - 2018



Carole Ann Williamson was born on 16 November 1946 in Toorak, Victoria to Leonard and Gwenda Marsh, the middle child between her brothers Owen and Graham. Carole grew up in Frankston & had many happy memories of growing up near the bay. She married Peter Williamson on 14 October 1967 in Frankston. They had three children, one son and two daughters, Steven, Kerry and Jody. Peter passed away on 14 October 1995, their 28th wedding anniversary.

Peter was a meteorologist and worked for the Bureau of Meteorology. This took Carole & Peter to some interesting places: Halls Creek, Sale, Lord Howe Island, Moree, Mackay and finally Brisbane. While in Mackay Carole attended the same high school as her children and completed her HSC. Not content with this, she then studied for a Bachelor of Arts majoring in English Literature & History. Carole had always been interested in family history & her family history in Wales in particular. She shared many interesting stories about her Welsh family that emigrated to Tasmania & played a significant part in early Hobart society, in particular two maiden aunts.

Carole joined GSQ around 2012 and served on the Management Committee from 2013 - 2016 and Vice-President in the 2015-16 year. She also served as the media relations person during her time on the committee and the editor of Generation with me from March 2015 until September 2016.

Carole was a very organised person & worked as an Executive Assistant at Independent Schools Queensland for over twenty years. This organisational ability came to the fore when Carole - and her lists - managed the move of GSQ from East Brisbane to the current site at Wishart. Without Carole, the move from Fisher Street to Wishart would not have been completed. We shared many laughs and tears over the removal period and those memories are precious to me.

Carole passed away peacefully on 17 October after a debilitating illness and was farewelled on Thursday 25 October at Mt Thompson East Chapel with a simple and moving service. Rest in Peace Carole - you will be missed.
