From the President

March 2020

Have you ever thought about Brisbane and its beginnings. How and why did the founders build some structures on the south side of the river and others on the north side? Why did the founders build residences where they did? Our Patron, Dr Jennifer Harrison, is presenting on this very subject at GSQ on Saturday, 14 March, 9.00am – 11.30am. Jennifer's presentation is focussed on convicts, but, let's face it, the convicts and their work very much helped to shape the face of Brisbane today. I encourage all GSQ members to come along to this presentation, even if your ancestors were not Queenslanders – you are one of those and really should be very aware of Brisbane's distant past. By the time you receive this edition of eNews you should have also received Communique 4 from the GSQ/QFHS Amalgamation Committee. There are some questions in this Communique which the Committee would like responses for, to guide further deliberations. You will note that the search for premises goes on – at this stage we've been unable to secure premises through the State Government or Brisbane City Council, although we haven't given up on these two as sources for premises – more meetings have been arranged! A decision has

been recently made that we may need to go to a commercial lease and we're seeking help from members of both societies to identify possible sites. The site should be located within 8 km of the City Centre – something with heritage significance would be great, but sites in industrial type areas would also be considered. We estimate that the amalgamated society would occupy 500 square metres – our current building at Wishart is approximately 200 square metres. If, while you're driving around Brisbane, you spot a possible building, I'd appreciate your contacting me at president@gg.org.au.

I would like to thank all involved in the recent Open Day. It was, I believe, a great success – this success was due to the work of the many volunteers on the day. Thank you all! 
